Dear Friends



Can we walk with God in the cold days of Spring?

February can be a month of hope; early spring flowers, especially snowdrops, begin to flower, and in these days of global warming, perhaps a brave daffodil. February can also be a month when winter feels unending, and we long for the warmer, longer days of spring.

It is also a busy month, especially this year when Easter falls relatively early. On 2 February, we mark Candlemas, the celebration of the 40-day old Jesus being presented in the Temple. Candlemas is associated with many country sayings, many centred around the midway point of winter, and the likely weather that is to come in what remains of winter.

Candlemas is also the point at which we turn from the manger to the cross. It was whilst Jesus was being presented in the Temple, that the godly Simeon took the child in his arms, giving thanks that he has seen God's salvation, and predicting the sword which will pierce Mary's heart when Jesus is crucified.

On 14 February this year, we turn in a very real way towards the cross, as we mark Ash Wednesday and the beginning of 40 days of Lent. The name 'Lent' comes from the old English word for 'lengthen', relating to the lengthening hours of daylight. It is a time of growth, both as the season of spring gains in strength, but also the spiritual growth which Christians seek as they prepare for Easter.

This leaves us with a challenge. Can we grow with God through this season of the year? Nearly 40 years ago, I was deeply struck by words written by the then Chaplain of what was, in those days, Chester College. I end with some of them now:

... The infant prince of Christmas becomes the strange, discomforting King of Good Friday. Can you live with that sort of King? In the cold spring days, can you grow up with him, and walk with him till Easter Day dawns?

Tea at the Tower Guided Walks


The next walks are:

Death Café

We have lots of laughter and a chance to talk about making the most of the time we have. The Death café movement has no agenda, objectives and themes. It is a discussion group rather than a grief support or counselling session.

The Twelve Disciples; St James, Son of Zebedee

James is the Patron Saint of Spain but was born in Bathsaida in Galilee in 4AD and was the brother of the Apostle John. Both were sons of Zebedee and Salome, and she was said to be Mary's sister, so both were first cousins of Jesus. When Jesus had called Peter and Andrew to follow Him, he saw James and John mending fishing nets with their father and called them to join Him too. They are known as the Boanerges [sons of Thunder] because of their robust belief in Jesus and his teachings. Together with Peter they are said to be the Apostles closest to Jesus and shared with Him the experiences of the miraculous catching of fish after a night of catching nothing, the raising of Jairus's daughter from death, the Transfiguration of Jesus, and His final night of prayers in the Garden of Gethsemane. When Samaritans refused Jesus' hospitality in their village the brothers are reported to have demanded that he bring down fire on the people. He responded by saying that He had come to save men, not destroy them.

After the death of Jesus, James went out to preach about the risen Lord. There are various legends concerning him preaching in Spain and returning to Jerusalem after seeing the Virgin Mary in a vision. In 44AD he was arrested by King Herod Agrippa and condemned to be beheaded for his preaching. It is said that the Roman soldier taking him to court was so affected by his faith and preaching that he immediately converted to Christianity. The Apostle blessed the soldier and kissed him, and both were beheaded together for their beliefs.

James was the second apostle to die [after Judas] and the first to be martyred. This martyrdom was said to have taken place in the Armenian Quarter of Jerusalem; James's head buried beneath the altar in the Cathedral. There is a belief that James's body was carried back to Spain in a stone boat, which landed at Padron. The body was carried overland to Santiago de Compostela in Galicia and buried. This town became a centre for pilgrimage and the Way of Saint James established to lead pilgrims to his burial site. Today the Santiago de Compostela is followed by over 300,000 people every year. To qualify to receive a Compostela pilgrims must walk 100km or cycle 200km. It has been the subject of numerous broadcasts and TV programmes and is now walked by believers, people of different faiths, and none.

A 6 week course looking at the Christian faith will be held after Easter, for anyone interested in Confirmation or in refreshing their understanding of the Christian faith.

If you have already been Confirmed but have recently come back to faith it is possible to renew your Baptism Vows as a way of publicly re-affirming your commitment to Christ. Adults who have not been Baptised and would like be Baptised are normally baptised and Confirmed at the same service.

Participating in the course does not commit you to being Confirmed, although you will need to do the course if you wish to be Confirmed, Baptised or renew your Baptism Vows.

Recipe

Shrove Tuesday Pancakes

Ingredients

- 4 ounces or 100grams of Plain Flour ō
- A pinch of salt ō
- ō 1 medium egg
- ō 1/2 Pint of skimmed milk

A heavy frying pan helps, as it will heat well and never stick.



A kiss for a woman. A cake for a man, Run to the Church, with a frying pan.

Method

- Blend all the ingredients together, and leave to stand for 20 minutes.
- Put a small knob of butter in the frying pan.
- Test for readiness by holding the palm of your hand over the pan.
- When you feel the heat rising, the pan is ready.
- When the pan and batter are hot, pour in just enough batter to cover the base of the pan, by tilting the pan around. Fry until golden brown and then toss or turn the pancake until the second side is also golden.
- It should look like a lace doily.
- Sprinkle with caster sugar and lemon juice and serve immediately.




St Oswald's School, Worleston


