#### Going, going, gone!

It seems amazing that over a year and a half has passed since I arrived at St Oswald's as a temporary Officiating Priest.

I remember how nervous I was then – I had only been ordained as a priest for 6 months, and was only halfway through my curate training. I did know some people through being connected to Wettenhall via the Rev'd Keith Hine (my brave Training Incumbent) and I had a very helpful introduction from Rev'd John Whitehead. What I remember most clearly is lots of lovely people, smiling in welcome and reminding me of their names, several times, until I'd remembered them.

And finally, I wondered what God had in mind. I was very glad to be working in Worleston Parish, but as a temporary post I was not at all sure what might happen next – to all of us.

Over the twenty months that have followed, I have had the most wonderful, happy and rewarding time with you all. It has been a steep learning curve for me – and it must have taking a bit of getting used to on your part too! – but it has been both stimulating and immensely enjoyable. Thank you for bearing with my mistakes and omissions, and for gently reminding me and encouraging me throughout. It has been a joy and a privilege to work with such excellent Churchwardens and Readers, and with a supportive PCC.

I have discovered that an Officiating Priest is free to do all sorts of things. The more usual ones include leading Sunday services; officiating at baptisms, weddings and funerals; visiting people; praying for people; doing school assemblies; and turning up for Parish events.

In addition, I've been lucky enough to have done some more unusual things too. The Pets' Service at Worleston. remains a highlight, as were the Good Friday 'Follow the Cross' journeys. Baptising a baby who grabbed my glasses and threw them into the font along with my service sheet was unexpected, as was the attendance of dear Penny Moss's festively-dressed dog in the front pew at her funeral. Working with wedding couples at St Oswald's has been a particular joy - I had never conducted a wedding before. I have been invited to look at nesting birds. faulty drains, historical documents and people's scars. Working with the school has also been rewarding and fun. I've been asked whether Jesus always had dirty feet, and whether vicars ever have friends.

I've driven nearly 5,000 miles commuting to Wettenhall and Worleston, have been fed much cake by sympathisers, and have developed an addiction to Worleston pies. And it has been an enormous privilege to be with you and your families at times of celebration, and at times of loss and grieving.

Finally, I've now found out what God had in mind for you and for me. For you, He has brought another big-hearted priest, Rev'd John Varty, to care for you. And for me, He has shown me how wonderfully kind, generous and forbearing people are, and how being members of a church together can be a very special sort of family. And now I am to go to Mellor Parish, and I know that I will find another branch of our family there too.

Thank you for all your support and encouragement, and for being a blessing to me. May God bless you always.



Hopefully after the downpours of June, as you read this, we will have had some hot and sunny weather and we have to think about watering. If you are worried about the water meter or a hose pipe ban consider investing in a water butt which via the drainpipe can collect water off your roof. You will be amazed even off a small roof, such as the garage or greenhouse, how much water you can collect quickly - and it's free! You can join two butts together and collect water just off one drain pipe. Another idea is to put a tank in the greenhouse and collect water off the greenhouse roof directly, this also saves walking out of the greenhouse.

If it is very dry you need to water wisely and prioritise pots, growbags and ornamental flowers. Watering lawns, shrubs and trees, unless newly planted, makes plants put down surface roots which leaves them weak. Putting mulch on the borders is another good way of keeping the moisture in.

If you are going away on holiday don't forget the indoor pot-plants. They might need a drink whilst you are away. One trick is to place a bucket of water slightly above the plant-pots and trail a piece of flannel from this into the pots and you will keep the plants moist. Make sure you don't do this on the carpet or wooden floor—find a sheltered spot outside or in the utility room.

Other than keeping the flower garden tidy with such jobs as keeping hedges in trim,

dead heading flowers and perhaps a little rose pruning there are not too many jobs to be done in the garden. If there has been a summer storm it is worthwhile checking any plant supports and making sure that they are firm.

Any edible crops such as the raspberries, strawberries, courgettes and potatoes should be harvested as they ripen. You can make preserves and pickles, and freeze any suitable produce you have been unable to eat or give away

August should be a month in which you can sit back and enjoy the garden, think about projects you want to do this winter or even have a barbecue.

MY SISTER'S KEEPER by Jodi Picoult ISBN 0-340-83546-X Hodder 2004

This would be a good text for book group – provided you have plenty of tissues on hand!

Thirteen year old Anna was conceived to allow her stem cells at birth to give her older sister Kate a chance to fight leukaemia. Since then she has provided various transfusions and injections to keep Kate going. But now sixteen year old Kate needs her kidney and Anna has had enough. She takes her parents to court to obtain medical emancipation from her family.

We see the problem from the point of view of each family member and the legal team involved as well. How many of us could make the decisions taken by the mother who loves both daughters but needs the body parts of the younger to save the older?

Well written and with a surprise ending, this is a worthwhile read and a good starter for a long discussion. It even has a romance running throughout as well!

#### A bit of the Bible ......

Jesus said 'it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God'. What does that mean? And how does it affect us today?

On the face of it, this seems a peculiar remark. How can something as big as a camel ever go through something as small as the eye of a needle? Was Jesus saying that a rich man can <u>never</u> enter the kingdom of God, that is to live a godly life?

On one level, it might be exactly what Jesus meant. He was replying to a young rich man who had asked Him what he needed to do in order to inherit eternal life. Jesus told him he should keep the commandments, then sell all his possessions, give the money to the poor, and follow Him. The young man could not do this, and turned away.

There is a story that the 'eye of the needle' was a gate in the walls around Jerusalem, which opened after the main gate was closed at night. A camel could only pass through this smaller gate if it was stooped down and had its baggage removed. This fable suggests that we can get bogged down with carrying worldly things around with us.

But another way of looking at it is that only God has the power to do the unthinkable, the impossible. We can't get a camel through a needle's eye, but such impossible tasks are possible for God. God can do **anything** to welcome those who turn to Him; if we open up just a tiny crack for Him, God will come pouring in.

#### Diocesan Synod 23 June 2012 Presidential Address

The Bishop (the full address is on the website) touched on:- The fact that as a national rather than a state church we need confidence. Patterns of ministry in this diocese are changing. The government's proposals for 'same sex marriage' have not been thought through. The Anglican Covenant is probably 'dead in the water'. That the 2 amendments to the Women Bishops debate due at General Synod next month, may complicate the issue. He is not certain that the time is right to pass the legislation to approve women bishops.


